Developing Speaking and Writing Skills in the Classroom

In this seminar we will take a look at the task types used by Cambridge ESOL to assess speaking and writing skills and use such tasks as a basis for classroom activities which promote communication in English in real-life situations.

Focussing on the B2 level, we will explore ideas which aim to develop students' active communication skills and help them to gain confidence when expressing themselves in English. Due to the positive marking approach which Cambridge ESOL uses, students are encouraged to be more adventurous with the language by using idiomatic expressions, collocations and a wider range of vocabulary and structures. The emphasis is on communication instead of getting everything perfect.
